The 2016 smash hit production of *Black Boys* played to packed houses, stellar reviews, and was nominated for a Dora Mavor Moore Award for Outstanding Performance – Ensemble. After embarking on a nation-wide tour to theatres in Vancouver (The Cultch, with Zee Zee Theatre), Calgary (High Performance Rodeo), and Montreal (Espace Libre, with Black Theatre Workshop), *Black Boys* comes back to Buddies this February for a limited two-week run.

A raw, intimate, and timely exploration of queer male Blackness, *Black Boys* is created from the lives of three people seeking a deeper understanding of themselves, of each other, and of how they encounter the world. As they explore their unique identities on stage, they subvert the ways in which gender, sexuality, and race are performed. Theatrical and intimate, *Black Boys* weaves together the ensemble's own personal stories in search of an integrated self and a radical imagination.

At the heart of the piece is an impressive ensemble of skilled young artists. The Dora-nominated ensemble – Stephen Jackman-Torkoff (*Botticelli in the Fire/Sunday in Sodom, Angels in America*), Tawiah Ben M'Carthy (*Obaaberima*), and Thomas Olajide (*Love's Labour's Lost, King Lear*) – have been seen on the stages of the Shaw Festival, the National Arts Centre, Canadian Stage, and the Stratford Festival. Director Jonathan Seinen has been the creative force behind *Unknown Soldier*, and *Like There's No Tomorrow*, while Dora Award-nominee Virgilia Griffith choreographs after establishing herself as a formidable performer in her own right, most recently in Cahoots Theatre's production of *Other Side of the Game*. The creative team is rounded out by dramaturge Mel Hague and designers Rachel Forbes (set and costume), Stephen Surlin (sound and video) and Jareth Li (lighting).
